### Treasurer's Update (Mary Buffinger)

- Cash position is on target/slightly ahead of budget. Waiting for Spring Carnival
- Enrichment Grants – \$2,093 left in the enrichment grant budget.
- Strong yearbook sales, numbers don't include on-line sales.
- Talent Show – still waiting for bills to finalize numbers
- NEF grant was filed by Seema for \$5,000 to cover additional classroom tools (back jack chairs, lap pads, noise cancelling headphones, etc.). This grant was **APPROVED**. We will need to fund the back jack chair covers.

### Grant Committee Update - Liz Lee

- **Owl Pellets: \$85.00** – R. Roberts- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade
- **Document Cameras: \$470.00** – M. DeCicco, for the entire school to use: 1 for each grade. We currently have 2 cameras but one is broken (being fixed). Look for NEF to fund a grant next year for one for each classroom.
- **Makey Makey: \$600.00;** M. DeCicco. 12 kits that transform objects into a keypad. Used in STEAM. Teaches innovative ways of programming and coding.
- **Fourth Grade Reading Journals: \$520.00.** These journals could move with students as they transition from 4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Since this for the general curriculum it was discussed that the PTC could fund it for this time however not on an on-going basis.

All grants were presented and approved.

## Meeting Minutes of March 11, 2015

The meeting came to order at 7:20 PM

The meeting minutes from January 20, 2015 were approved.

### **Co-President Updates**

1. **Raffle Items Needed:** We are actively looking for raffle items and welcome your help. The types of items we are collecting are ones that parents, children and/or entire families may enjoy such as donated items, services, tickets, gift cards, etc.
2. **Needham Gives Back! An annual day of service supporting Cradles to Crayons:** We need gently used clothes (all seasons), shoes, coats, small toys, baby equipment and books and **new** pajamas, socks and underwear for children ages 0-14 years. There is a box in the school lobby to collect all the items. No stuffed animals please.  
**Cradles to Crayons is also looking for volunteers to help sort through the donated items on March 28<sup>th</sup> at the high school from 10 am – 2 pm. No need to register, just show up.**

### **Treasurer's Update (Mary Buffinger)**

Four fundraisers were held so far this year:

1. Bingo Night - \$449 profit but we need to deduct the candy
2. Skating Party – all proceeds went to Babson (for insurance reasons/costs)
3. Basketball Game – profit of \$2,200.
4. Pending Modell's funds from the partnership we had with them.

Enrichment Grants – \$2,800 left in the enrichment grant budget.

### **Grant Committee Update - Seema Meloni**

1. Coding Games—\$387.71 Games for the Media Center. Examples include Robot Turtles, Code Monkey, etc. to teach kids coding, conditional statements, etc. and is intended to supplement STEAM initiatives
2. Back-Jack chairs—\$566.83. Submitted by Margaret Petrovich plus the support of 10 faculty members. Funds will be used to purchase 10 new backjack chairs and 10 covers. It helps support children who get fidgety and also helps control personal space. These chairs can be used by any student. Stephanie Pearl may be able to help get these at a lower cost.
3. Wood for Art projects—\$100.00 Submitted by Mr. Walek

All grants were presented and approved.

### **School Committee Update (Heidi Black)**

Heidi provided the following updates on the "Hillside School Project" plus other important updates.

- **Hillside School Project –Feasibility Study Update** (some content pulled from Citizens for Needham Schools email newsletter)

Needham is currently in the early stages of a partnership with the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) to renovate or rebuild the Hillside Elementary School. During a recent meeting of the MSBA's

Designer Selection Committee on March 4th, Dore and Whittier was chosen as the design firm for the Hillside feasibility study that will get underway this spring.

The goal is to have the study completed by August and the School Committee would like to present findings at November Town Meeting.

4 options will be included in the feasibility study:

1. A new Hillside school at current Hillside location
2. A renovation of the existing building at Hillside
3. A new school at DeFazio
4. A green field

- **School Committee Open House** (content pulled from Citizens for Needham Schools email newsletter)

On **Saturday, March 21st from 9:00 - 10:30 am at Pollard Middle School**, the School Committee invites community members to its semi-annual Open House. This is a great opportunity to meet School Committee members in an informal setting and to share with them any questions or concerns you may have.

- **Other School Committee News: 1:1 ipad Study** (content pulled from Citizens for Needham Schools email newsletter)

At its March 3rd meeting, the School Committee voiced support for the 1:1 Personalized Learning Initiative at the middle school level and indicated a significant change in how 1:1 devices (iPads) will likely be funded going forward.

Needham's current 1:1 program utilizes a "Bring Your Own Device" funding mechanism. Going forward, the Needham Public Schools intends to provide district-owned devices for students. The School Committee indicated its strong support for this change at its March 3rd meeting, and the specific funding details for this change are still being worked out. It is expected families will still have the option to purchase their own iPad device for use at school if they wish. Based on projections, NPS should be able to fund the devices within its capital allotment from the Town for the next two budget years, however, starting in FY18, additional funds would be needed to continue providing devices as part of this program.

Information about the proposed changes, including some of the findings related to the 1:1 initiative from the School Committee's Technology Transition sub-committee, is available online in the School Committee Packet for March 3rd.

### **Math for Parents!—Mr. Kascak, Hillside Principal and Elaine McKenna, Hillside Math Coach**

Mr K. and Ms. McKenna presented the basics of the Think Math program used at Hillside which is to teach understanding math using manipulatives/visuals so students can understand the “why” rather than only teaching procedures (memorization). They took the parents through some hands on exercises so they could get an understanding of how our children are learning math. After students master the manipulative learning they move on to learn the procedural method, which is in future grades (5/6). In grades 4 & 5 teachers begin to teach the Engaged New York Lessons, which offers parent support tools via their website.

There was strong interest in having parent and/or parent with child workshops in the next school year to explain the Think Math program fundamentals.

Treasurer's update—Mary Buffinger: Not much has changed in the budget from the last PTC report (December). We are staying on track with revenue. We made about a \$100 from the 3 Squares fundraiser.

Grant Committee Update—Liz Lee: there was one application to discuss.

- Approved-Iditarod grant requested by the 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers. This is an insider guide to the Iditarod. This grant will integrate the program into curriculum. It is a duplicate from last year. The grant is for \$70.00.
- A discussion followed about the role of PTC in giving out grant funds. We want to encourage new, innovative ideas. But we also want to support repeat grants. The question came up of how we absorb successful grants into the curriculum. Suggestions were made to set aside a certain amount of money to put toward repeat grants that cannot be funded. Also PTC should ask for all repeat grants at beginning of the year so we know what we will be asked to fund.
- The A to Z grant for the think Math books came in over budget. Some money was swapped to help pay for the difference.

NEF update—Michelle Hoffmeister: It is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the NEF. Michelle pointed out many important programs at Hillside have been funded by NEF such as, Leslie interns, lazy legs, iPad initiative, Let's build, Mural. Also, Needham Talks program, The Boston Project at the High School and the Divinci Lab at the High School. **Grants are due to NEF by March 19<sup>th</sup>**. Applications are not too difficult or time consuming so everybody is encouraged. Our NEF school representative is Ms. Miller. There is a celebration for the 25<sup>th</sup> year on March 13<sup>th</sup>

and March 14<sup>th</sup> . On March 13<sup>th</sup> there will be a pancake breakfast at the High School and on March 14<sup>th</sup> there will be a celebration in the Divinci Lab at the High school. Also the NEF spelling bee will be on Sunday March 14<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm.

Calendar Raffle Update: Amy Lam presented and noted that we are trying to find donations. Robyn wrote a letter that volunteers could use to help ask local businesses or restaurants for donations. It is a formalized offer letter that volunteers could print and drop off with potential donors. If they agree to donate we will send them a Thank you note that will include the PTC's tax ID number. We will have a link to the letter on the website for volunteers to download. The raffle will take place before the Year End Carnival (June 14) but we may change the name and modify the raffle slightly. Some ideas were having a silent auction for big ticket items, having grades donate baskets of goodies, and possibly a child-made art auction with art that all kids help to create (possibly by grade) with the art teachers.

The meeting minutes from the October 15, 2014 were approved.

### **Co-President Updates**

### **Treasurer's Update (Stephanie Pearl)**

Four fundraisers were held so far this year:

1. The New 5K event – over \$5K in profit!
2. Book Fair – same as last year, and on budget. Brought in \$2, 959 in profit.
3. Genevieve's Gift Wrap – almost \$400 over budget. Brought in \$4,394 in profit.
4. Spirit Wear – larger than expected return. Brought in over \$2K in profit.

Fall Fun Night made \$123.

**Directory** – printing services for our directory were donated so we saved \$982 on this line item. If you have printing needs in the future please consider giving your business to Kreate and Print and tell them you're a Hillside family and appreciate their service.

Enrichment Grants – we've spent 25% of the total budget which is right on target.

Overall, we are on track for a solid financial year.

### **Grant Committee Update (Robin Gamrath-Schauman)**

We had one application to discuss.

- 1) **APPROVED- A to Z grant** request submitted by Christina Tarantino. Provide reading level, printable books for teachers to use in class. All grades/all classes will be able to benefit from this grant. The request was for \$99.95 for subscription to the site.

### **School Committee Update (Heidi Black)**

Heidi gave an update since the meeting she attended. She had 2 recent events to bring up related to the "Hillside Project". There was lengthy discussion on this topic.

## **Hillside Project**

1. Preparations are underway for the Feasibility Study. The Request for Services (RFS) outlines the options to be studied. The Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) added in an option that states that “any other site to be determined and with approval of the town” can be studied as an option for a new school. So the RFS includes an option to study a “green field.”
2. Two presentations were held to outline the Town’s Master Plan that includes all potential projects that could start now through the next 25 years. One issue that was highlighted was that if a school is built at DeFazio field, the DPW currently on that site would need to relocate and this could cost the town \$50MM.

These two events combined with questioning by the Finance Committee (about the exclusion of Cricket Field) could potentially impact the study to include Cricket or another area that could accommodate a new school.

### **Key Dates:**

1/27/15: meeting will be held to short list the designers bids

2/10/15: interview the short list of designers followed by designer selection

Overall Timing for the “Hillside Project” would include a 2016 override and a 2020 opening of a new school.

School Committee Meetings begin with a Public Forum to cover items that are NOT on the agenda for that meeting. Heidi encouraged all Hillside parents to attend these forums to present their views.

As stated previously, Heidi is willing and happy to meet with any parents or groups that want to discuss this project or any other issues that impact Hillside.

Jodi Rooney and Liz Lee offered to meet with parents to discuss the details of the Hillside Project.

### **Class Sizes - Mr. K.**

Key Facts: The ELC program for 3 -5<sup>th</sup> grades in Needham is held at Hillside.

Current Hillside class sizes: In 4<sup>th</sup> grade there are 76 kids in 3 sections (1:7 teacher to student ratio). In 3<sup>rd</sup> grade there are 72 kids in 4 sections (1:9 teacher to student ratio).

Mr. K. indicated that the MCAS scores from the current 4<sup>th</sup> grade class (exam taken last year) suggest that the larger class sizes haven’t negatively impacted the academic performance of these students. They actually scored the highest of any grade.

### **Options being explored:**

1. No changes to sections
2. Switch number of sections (start looking at changing 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> grade sections to balance the load).
3. Explore multi-grade classrooms, possibly combining 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students in one or two sections (not all sections of both classes). Or look to combine younger students in multi-grade rooms, K&1, 1&2, etc.

There was a lot of discussion by the parents in attendance. specifically concerning the impact of the current 4<sup>th</sup> grade class also finishing 5<sup>th</sup> grade in very large classroom sizes.

Mr. K and Ms. List will be looking at data from each grade, and will meet with teachers, to find the best solution.

An update will be provided in an upcoming PTC meeting in early 2015.

### **Other updates:**

Mr. K noted that Amy Lam coordinates having the 5<sup>th</sup> grade class send out thank you notes to any person or group that has helped the school. If you have someone you would like to send a thank you note to, please contact Amy.

## Meeting Minutes of October 15, 2014

The meeting came to order at 7:15 PM

Attendance included 4 Board Members- Jessica Young was unable to attend.

Seema Meloni opened with a welcome to new board members PTC co-secretaries: Deb Feldman and Lesly Murray, co-Treasurer: Stephanie Pearl and Welcome back to co-treasurer Mary Buffinger.

The meeting minutes from the May 28, 2014 were approved.

### Treasurer's Update (Mary Buffinger)

Mary presented the income statement. She reported the budget is tight this year. We are spending exactly what is in the budget. The enrichment budget was reduced by \$1,000 from the previous year. We spent \$1,200+ last year to kick start the Let's Build program. Now that it is off and running we will not need to spend that much on the same program.

Good news is that we brought in more from the mosaic fundraiser than originally anticipated. We are looking for new and creative fundraising ideas. If you have any ideas please send them to the Hillside PTC.

Please Note: we support matching gift programs that your employer may offer. Please take advantage of this if it's available to you.

### Grant Committee Update (Robin Gamrath-Schauman)

The budget is 4,000 this year. We had 3 applications to discuss.

- 1) APPROVED- Math picture books for the entire 1<sup>st</sup> grade. One set per classroom. This will align with the Think Math curriculum and Mass State standards. The grant is for between \$350-400.
- 2) APPROVED- Mrs. Hurley is requesting an iPad Tripod stand at a cost of \$100. This is a stand to be used school wide. It helps with making videos.
- 3) APPROVED- Playground Painting Grant. School interns will work with 5<sup>th</sup> graders to redo the Map and Chess board on playground. The paint is donated by the town. 2 \$250 gift cards to interns for their time.

### PTC Event Update –Halloween 5K Trick or Treat-Sunday, October 26th (Seema Meloni)

This is the first year for this event. The money will go to helping expand the iPad project so we can have 1 to 1 iPads in the classrooms and additional programs. There will be

fantastic activities and programs. The FUN run for kids starts at 8:30 AM. The 5K will start at 9:00am. The running route is within the Hillside community. We need people to spread the word and we are still looking for volunteers. Hillside faculty have come together and formed a team, the Hillside Hornets, so keep your eyes open on the race route!

Also part of the race will be the Golden Pumpkin Award, awarded to the class that has the most kids registered for the race.

### School Committee Update (Heidi Black)

Heidi gave several updates during the meeting. 4 key priorities for the School Committee were outlined:

#### 1) Hillside Project

Needham and the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) are currently conducting a project feasibility study on the renovation/rebuilding of the Hillside Elementary School. The School Committee is committed to achieving a community consensus on a preferred alternative and seeking MSBA approval by the end of the school year. More information about future renovation projects at the Hillside and Mitchell elementary schools is available on the [NPS website](#).

The Hillside project was a long discussion. Heidi gave the update that the three options on the table are 1) rebuilding on the hillside site 2) Building an elementary school at DeFazio 3) building a 6<sup>th</sup> grade at DeFazio and making High Rock an elementary school. Cost will be a factor. The solution of Cricket field which may be the cheapest & easiest is not a current option. There is a town meeting, Wednesday October 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7 pm, Powers Hall at the Town Hall. The Hillside community is encouraged to show up to school committee meetings, attend public hearings, and stay informed.

#### 2) Additional Space for Needham High

High enrollment at Needham High School is putting stress on classroom and communal spaces. Working with other Town departments, the School Committee plans to address space concerns at Needham High. The administration has been creatively repurposing and re-allocating existing rooms and offices to provide more instructional space. The next step, partitioning two existing classrooms, is to be accomplished through a Warrant Article at the October Special Town Meeting. A larger proposal to address space needs at the High School over the next decade is expected later this year.

#### 3)iPads at High Rock

This year's 6th grade class is participating in a 1:1 iPad initiative wherein all students are using an iPad device at school. Some of the goals of this program are to increase students' organization, provide more opportunities for personalized learning and collaboration, and provide a device students can use during their three years of middle school. CNS plans to provide additional information on the status of the [High Rock iPad implementation](#) in future newsletters.

#### 4) Full Day Kindergarten Study

Needham does not currently have full day kindergarten due to space and financial constraints. However, the School Committee is committed to implementing full day kindergarten as soon as possible and has created a standing sub-committee to begin planning for this.

#### New Extended Day Programming Mr. Kascak

Extending the school day by 25 minutes has allowed for the following new initiatives at Hillside:

- STEAM has been starting off very successful. 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> graders have 4 rotations per year. See attached schedule for the STEAM rotations this year. Students are studying elements of music in the math section and art in the technology section.
- Hillside has hired a Spanish teacher, Mr. Pat Marra. He is doing a great job with the introduction to Spanish in grades 1-5. Spanish will not be on the report card this year.
- Collaborative time for the teachers. There are 6 grade level leaders.

#### Other updates:

Let's Build: Mr. K gave a special Thank You to Liz Lee and Sophia Buckley for the wonderful success with the Let's Build program. The next Let's Build day is November 8, 2014 at Broadmeadow.

Trip to China/Host a Chinese Student: There will be an informational meeting on Tuesday, October 28<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm at Hillside for any parents interested in joining Mr. K. and teachers on a trip to China (either spring 2015 or 2016) or hosting a student from China during this school year. This is informational only and not an obligation to participate.

Space Constraints: There are still issues with space in the school and scheduling. The gym has the toughest space crunch. There are some simultaneous gym classes planned.

#### Closing remarks from Seema:

If you anyone would like to see topics discussed at future PTC meetings, please submit your ideas. Upcoming suggestions include more information on the Think Math program and PARC vs. MCAS testing.
